Ad Practices *Accomplishments*

- Briefed various EU and US regulators on fundamentals of online advertising technology and the privacy landscape

 - CCPA impacts to online advertising
 - Data Subject Access Requests under GDPR
 - Data fingerprinting
- Co-hosted COPPA at 20: Protecting Children's Privacy in the New Digital Era

Accomplishments

- Spoke at or hosted 43 student privacy events in 2018, including testifying before Congress and the Federal Commission on School Safety and presenting at the OECD-University of Zurich Expert Consultation on *Protection of Children in a Connected World*;
- Held a student privacy bootcamp for district superintendents in collaboration with AASA on July 9th; a bootcamp for SEA privacy staffers on July 24th and 25th; and two bootcamps for edtech vendors at SXSWedu and ISTE;
- Participated on the New York State Education Department Data Privacy Advisory Council to provide feedback on regulations implementing New York's 2014 student privacy law;
- Released several publications

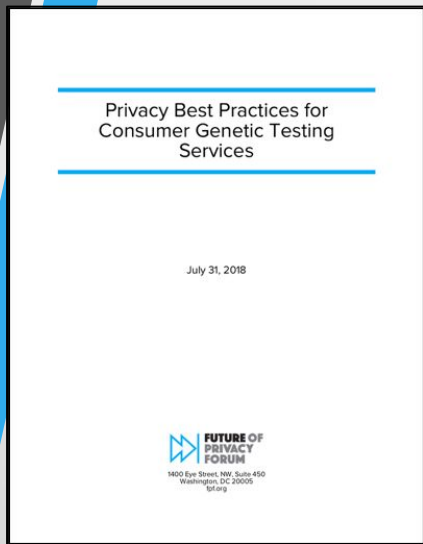

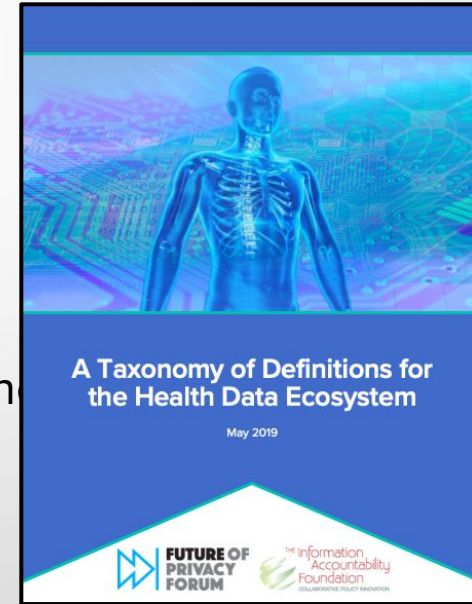
